

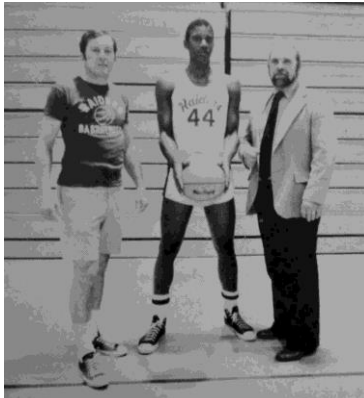

## 1966-67 Raiders

**Jerry "Doc" Fabiano** was the founding father of FMCC basketball. He laid down the foundation for success that all coaches that followed him were fortunate to be able to build upon. His motto of "Dedication, Desire, and Defense" was printed on the team's practice uniforms, and that is exactly what he demanded from his players. The Raiders were regularly ranked among the best defensive teams in the country. He coached the Raiders from 1964 to 1983, with a one-year sabbatical (1975-76). During that time he compiled a record of 269-145 (.650). Starting with the '68-69 season Doc's teams were 239-101 (.703) with 12 Conference Championships and one Region III Championship and were often ranked high in both the regional and national polls. In those days there were no Division I, II, or III teams, as all Junior College schools were in the same classification, no matter what size the school was and whether or not they gave their players scholarships (which the Raiders did not). Doc's teams always played an ambitious schedule, taking on many nationally ranked teams with a great deal of success.

Doc was inducted into the Upstate New York Basketball Hall of Fame in 2017. He was nominated and introduced by former NBA player and current Dallas Mavericks Head Coach, Rick Carlisle. Carlisle starred for Fabiano's Adirondack team that won the Men's Open Division Title in the 1980 Empire State Games. Doc was also elected to the Niagara Falls Sports Hall of Fame in 2019.

The Raiders inaugural season (1964-1965) was a struggle from the beginning, as they lost every game the first semester, mostly by large margins. Then Amsterdam's Rick Cetnar, a Siena College transfer, played basketball for the Raiders in the spring of 1965. Cetnar's arrival made the Raiders competitive for the first time, though they finished 1-14; they were on their way to a bright future.

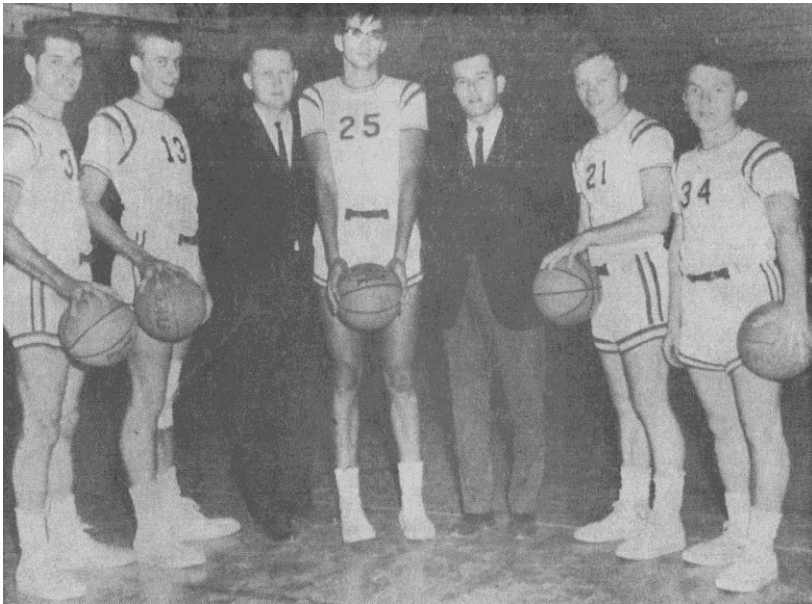

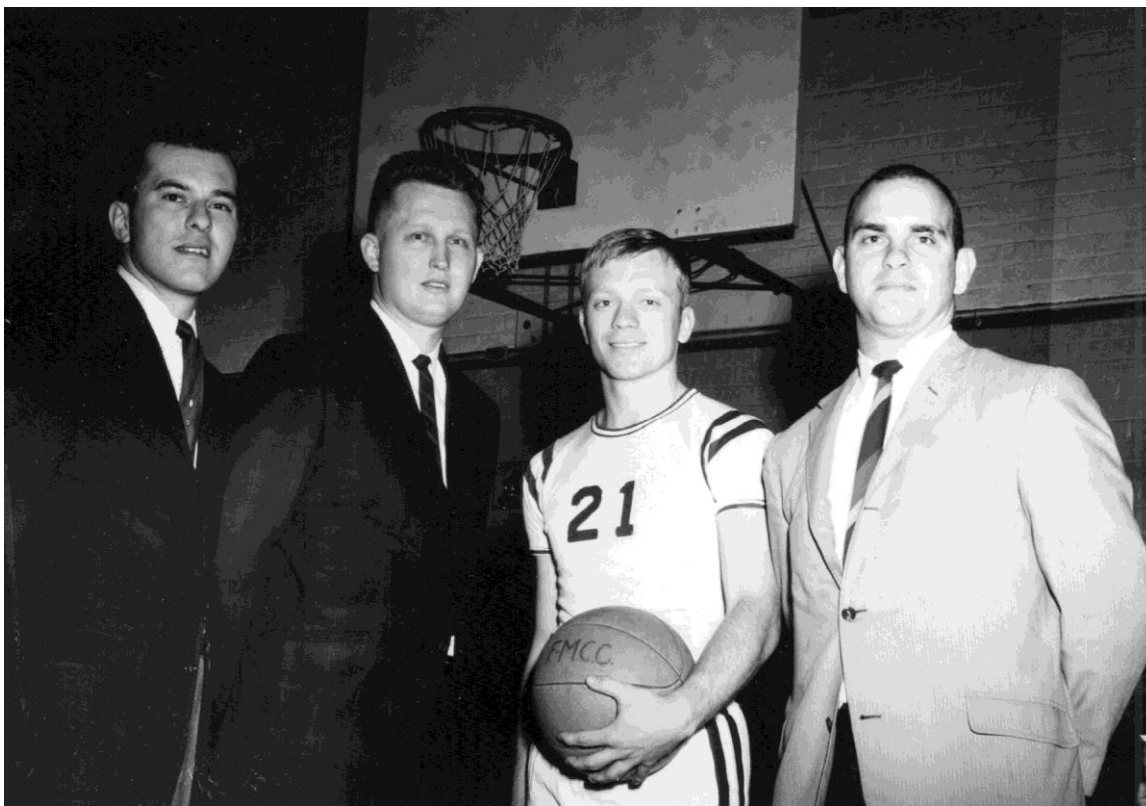
FMCC's first winning team came in their second season. Several good players from Amsterdam High School followed Rick Cetnar to FMCC.

**1964-1965 & 1965-1966 FMCC Raiders - #21 Rick Cetnar**

North Eastern Collegiate Conference All-Star & FMCC Athlete of the Year (1965-66)

Cetnar, a 5'10" guard from Amsterdam NY, was the first star player for the Raiders.

In FMCC's inaugural season (1964-1965), Rick played the second semester and averaged 22.3 points.

In his second season, he averaged 18.0 points and led the Raiders to their first winning season.

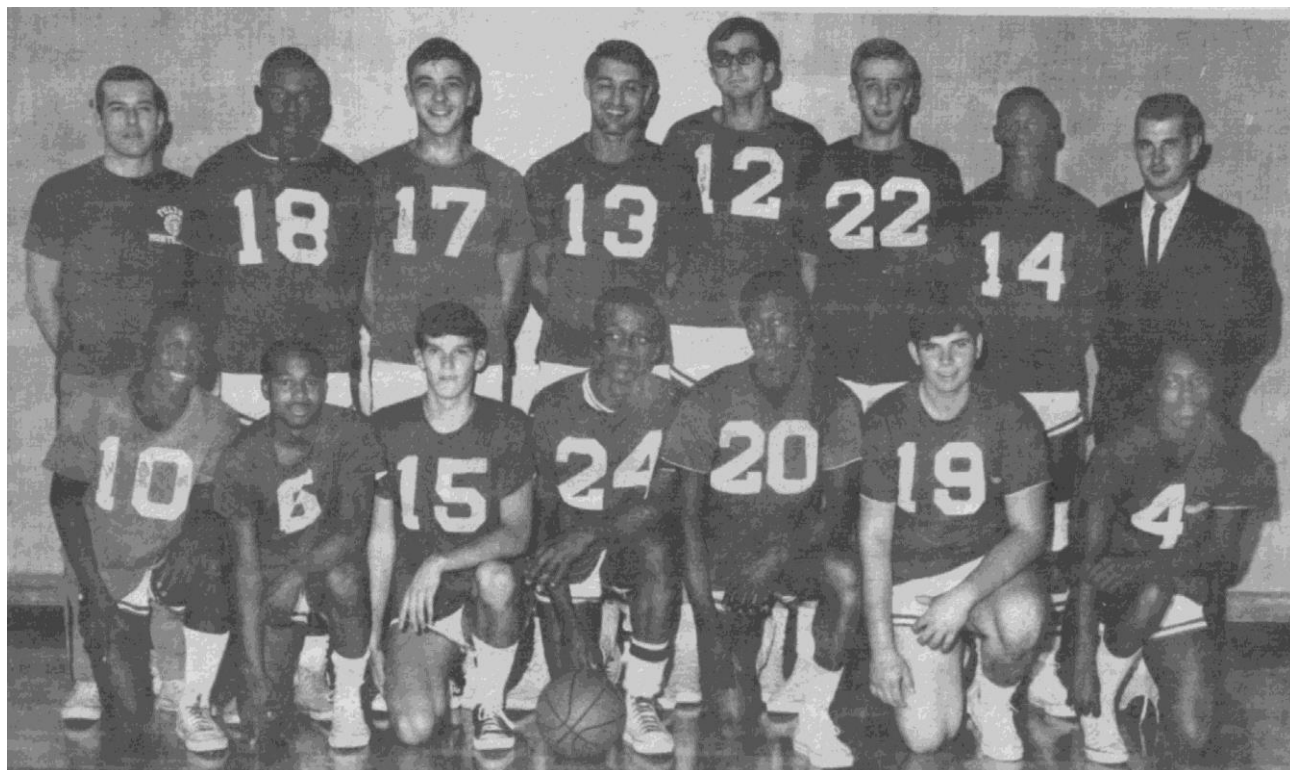
Rick transferred to R.I.T. after finishing up at FMCC, where he averaged more than 18 points per game and was a team captain in both his junior and senior seasons. He later became a very successful varsity basketball coach at both Bishop Scully and Amsterdam High School, winning 247 games in 19 seasons. He led AHS to the Section II Class A Championship in 1977 and a Regional Title in 1996.

Rick's son, Todd, starred on the 1992-96 teams and became Amsterdam's all-time leading scorer and earned All-State honors in 1996. Todd also had a successful career, playing at Division I SUNY Albany, scoring 1,345 points, and finished ninth on Albany's all-time scoring list and was one of only two players in the school's history to combine for 1,000 points, 350 assists, and 150 steals at the time of his graduation.

Both Todd (2014) and Rick (2015) were inducted into the Upstate New York Basketball Hall of Fame.

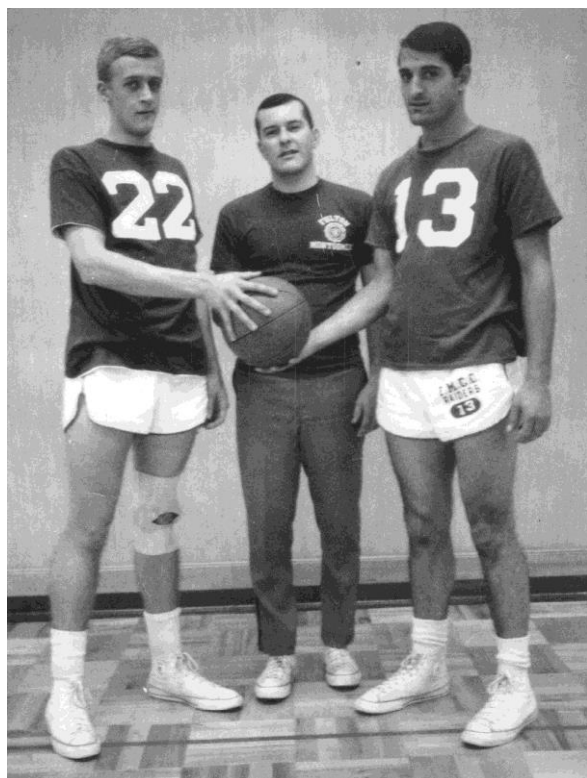

Schuyler and Marotta, both from Amsterdam High School, starred for the Raiders from 1965-1967.

Bob Marotta, a 6'3" forward, was the Raiders first Region III All-Star and a two time SUJCAC All-Star. He finished his career with several FMCC records including: Points Scored Season/Career (440/779), Scoring Average Season/Career (22.0/21.05), and Rebound Total/Average for a season (219/11.0).

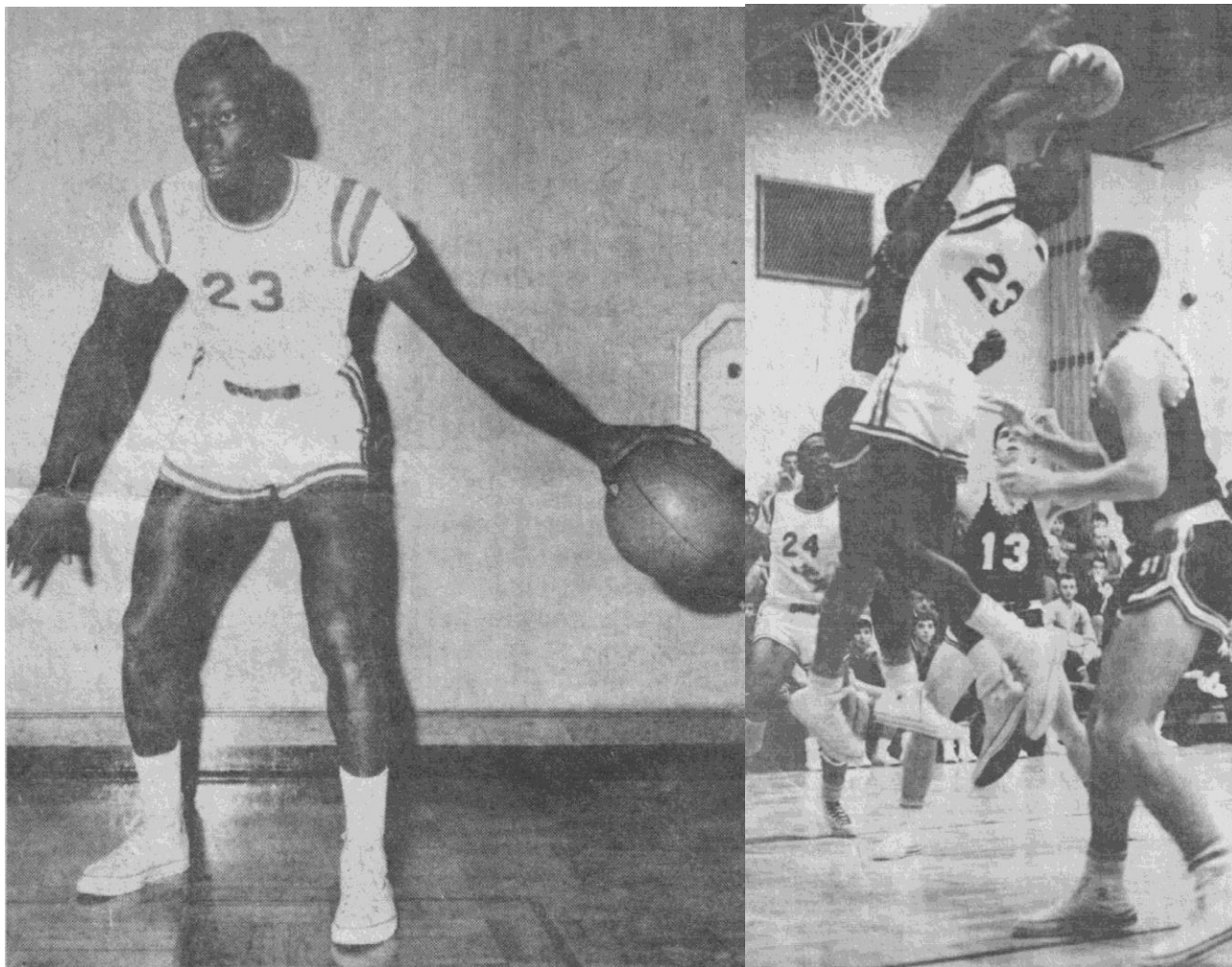
Bob transferred to St. Ansalem College after FMCC. His son, Chris, would also star for the Raiders in the future (1997-99).

Phil Schuyler, an athletic 6'4" forward, was an excellent scorer and rebounder, averaging 18.4 and 7.5, respectively, for the 1966-67 season, as well as 11.7 points per game in 1965-66.

Phil transferred to St. Wayland Baptist College after FMCC.

**1966-1967 FMCC Raiders - #23 Franklin Starks**

A versatile 6'2" player from Trott Vocational in Niagara Falls, NY, Frank led his team to two sectional championships with his superlative scoring and all-around play. There was no NY State tournament in those days, so a Sectional Championship was the ultimate team prize. He received All-Western New York Boys Basketball First-Team honors for his outstanding performance. Frank possessed incredible athletic ability, and did everything (shoot, dribble, pass, defend and rebound) exceptionally well on the basketball court. He later toured with the Harlem Diplomats, a Canadian version of the Harlem Globetrotters and also played for the Al Maroone AAU squad that scrimmaged future NBA Fall-of-Famer Calvin Murphy and the Niagara University team. Murphy later recalled Frank Starks was one of the best individual opponents he faced as a collegian.

Frank is the grandfather of James Starks, the starting fullback for the Super Bowl XLV Champion Green Bay Packers and all-time rushing leader at the University of Buffalo. A talented basketball player in his own right, and member of the 2005 New York State AA Champion Niagara Falls team, James said of his grandfather, "I hear he really had it cookin'. He had a pure shot and handle out of this world."

Frank is also the uncle of current NBA player and former Syracuse University basketball Star Jonny Flynn. Flynn said, "If you talk to the old guys in my neighborhood, they always bring up Frank Starks. He was the best player to come out of Niagara Falls. When they find out I'm his nephew, they say that's where I got it from."

The first star recruit for Fabiano from outside of the Fulton-Montgomery county area, Frank only played 10 games for the Raiders, but he made a major impact, leading FMCC to an 8-2 start while averaging 24.2 points and setting the Raider's scoring record with 40 points vs Berkshire Christian (11/13/66).

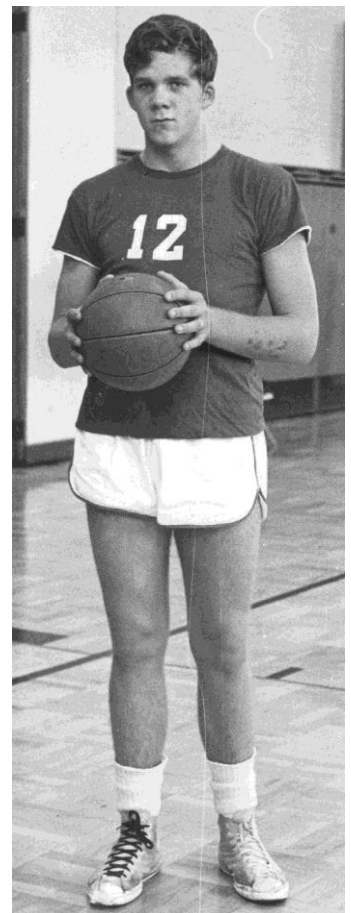

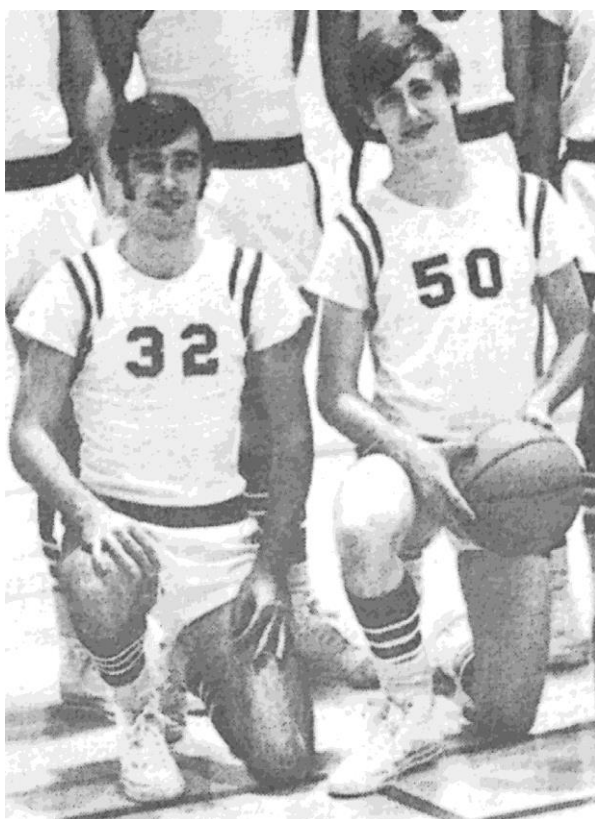
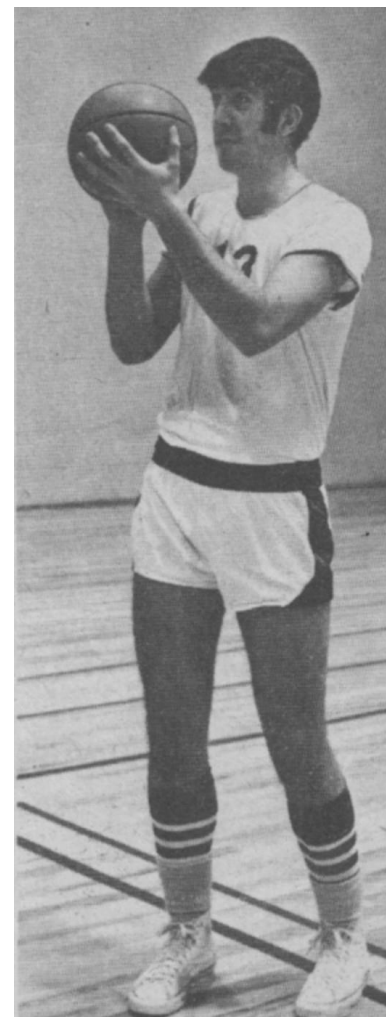
**The 1969-70 Raiders** were known as "Fab's Fleas", mostly because they were under-sized; featuring four guards between 5'9" and 6' tall (Hart, Pollak, Shea, and Reynolds) along with forwards LePore (6'4"), Bouchard (6'2") and Seren (6'2"), but also because they were real "pests" on defense. The Raiders averaged 81.7 points per game while allowing their opponents only 69.2 points per game for the season.

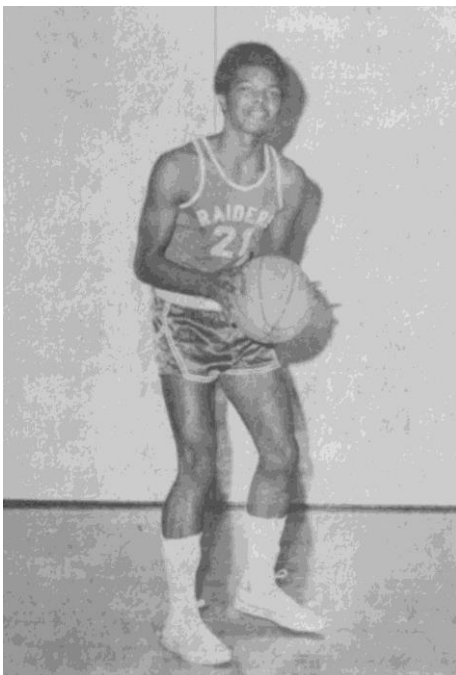

Coach Fabiano took a one-year sabbatical in '75-76, but the Raiders' success continued under interim coach Bill Carmody (a former stand-out guard and assistant coach at Union College). The Raiders finished with a 16-9 record and were Mountain Valley Collegiate Conference co-Champions

Doc didn't leave the cupboards bare. Returning from the '74-75 MVCC Champs were Dan Jarvis, Rich Alexander, and Ron Minus. Doc brought in new recruits too. Among them were Bruce Hennings, Jack Acevedo, and Robbie Conover. Acevedo and Conover made major contributions in '75-76; unfortunately, Hennings was injured early in the season and missed several games with a fractured kneecap and was not in top form when he did return. This trio would become tri-captains for the '76-77 Region III Champions. Other freshman included: Al Martin, Charlie Forman, Mark Winslow, and Bronson Frank. Bronson is the younger brother of former Raider Barron Frank.

Acevedo, Jarvis and Martin all made the Mountain Valley Collegiate Conference All-Star team. Acevedo scored 415 points (17.3 per game) and was also picked to the SUJCAC All-Star team and was MVCC MVP.

Coach Bill Carmody did a remarkable job, especially for a first-time head coach. Due to injuries, academic ineligibility and other issues the Raiders suited-up only 6 or 7 players for most of the 2<sup>nd</sup> semester and played the last game with only 5 guys. They finished two games with 4 players and another with just 3. Yet, they ended the year winning 11 of their last 14 games and the final 5 in a row.



Coach Carmody went on to become a successful NCAA Division I coach. He led Princeton to Ivy League titles and to NCAA tournament appearances in 1997 and 1998. He moved on to Northwestern in 2000 and has a career NCAA record of 212-174 as of 2009. His time at FMCC had to be an invaluable experience.

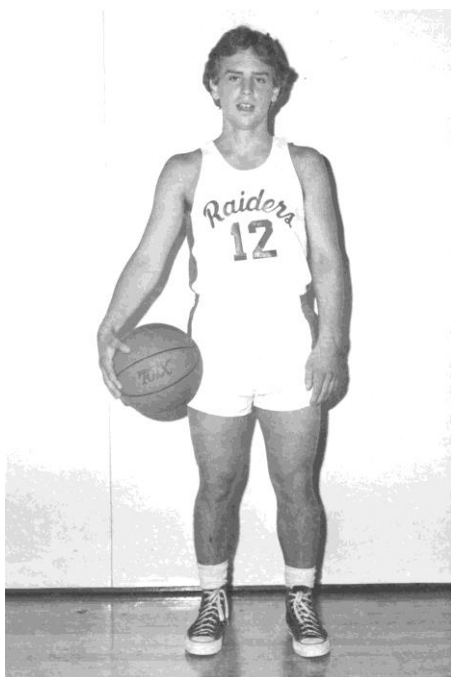

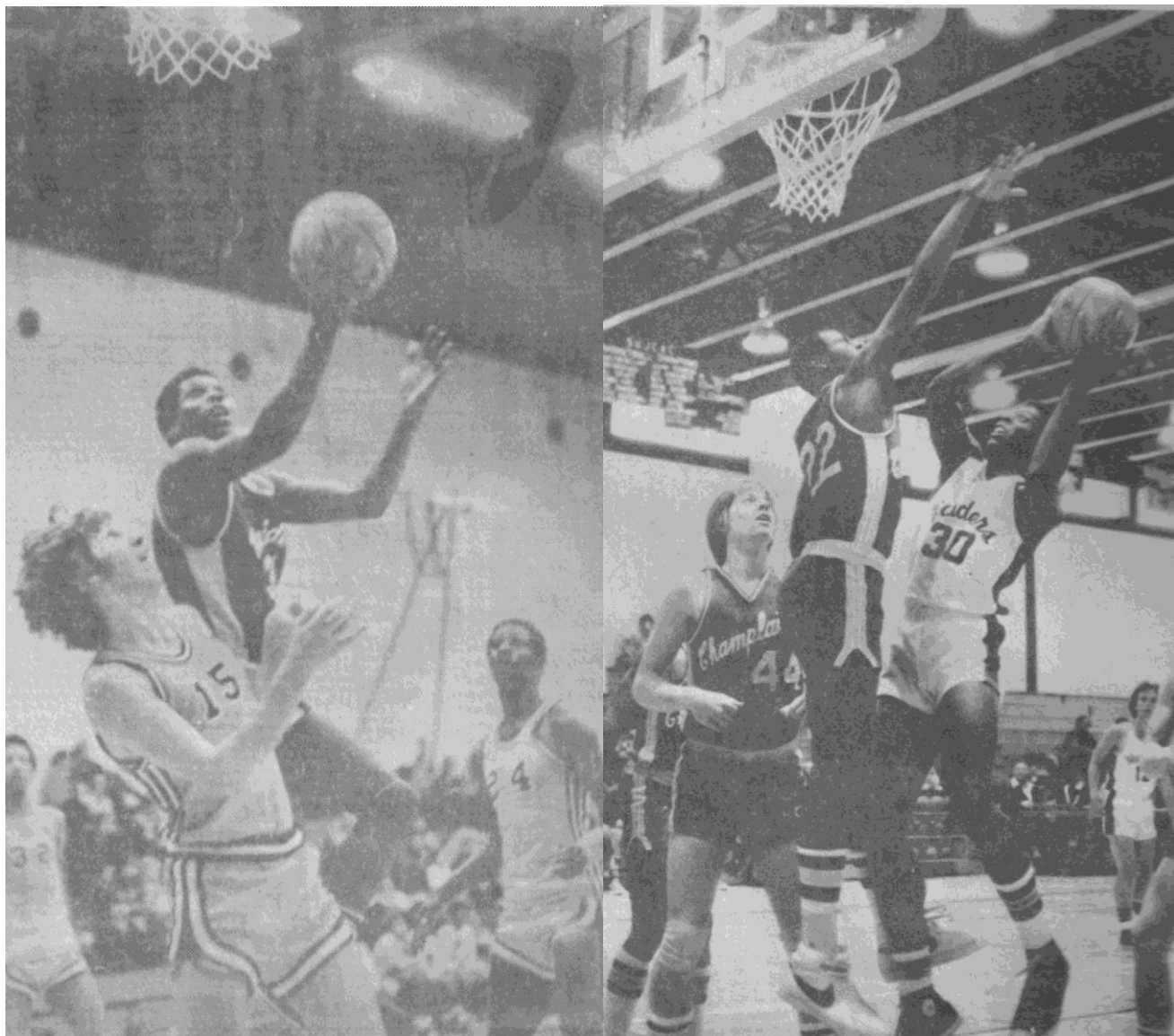

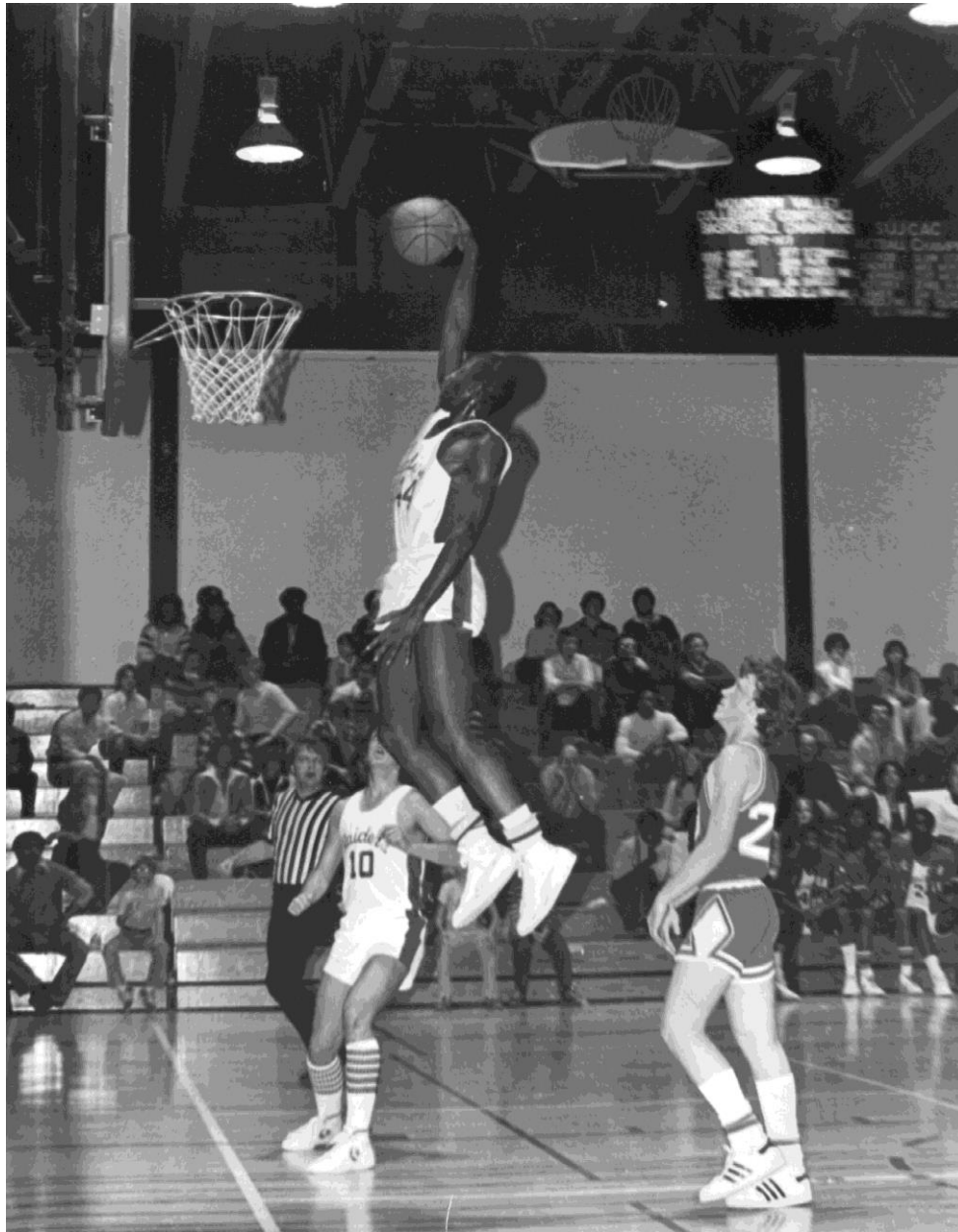

Bruce "Helicopter" Hennings was a versatile 6'1" center/forward/guard from Burgard Vocational in Buffalo, NY. After suffering a fractured kneecap early in his freshman season, Bruce returned for the final 8 games, but was not fully in shape and was favoring his injured leg. However, he came back strong for his second season. Despite his lack of size, Bruce dominated in the paint with an incredible vertical jump (he could get his head near the rim from a standing start) and an assortment of Dr J like moves. Bruce was a complete player and a real team player. He was just as happy passing to an open teammate as scoring himself and was a great defender. Athletes like Bruce don't come around very often, except in this case. This team also had Clifford Wilson. No wonder they won 30 games and the Region III Championship, without a starter over 6'2".

After graduating from FMCC, Bruce transferred to Division II Mercyhurst College in Erie, PA. He led the team in Rebounds and Field Goal % and was second in scoring on the way to an NAIA District Championship with a 26-3 record in 1977-78, the most successful season in the school's history. The following year Bruce was Mercyhurst's top scorer, as the team had another winning season.

In the photo above, Cliff dunks from well beyond the free throw line. Despite standing only 6'2" tall, Cliff had as many as 12 dunks in a single game and often got rebounds with his head near the rim. He had an assortment of spectacular slams during games that are un-surpassed by anything seen in the NBA to this day. Cliff also blocked 15 shots in one game and once blocked a shot near the top of the backboard. He would easily be the Raiders' All-time leader in blocked shots, but they didn't become an official statistic until the 1983-1984 season.

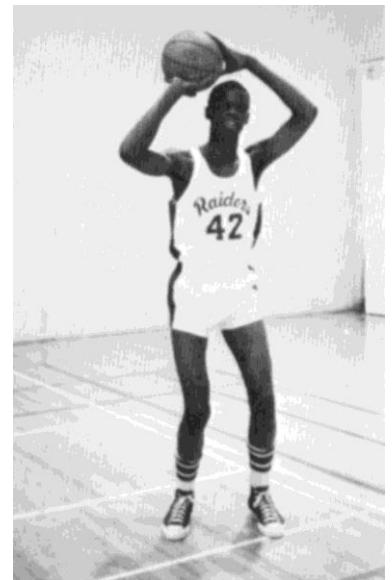

One of the few bright spots, in a disappointing 1977-1978 season for the Raiders, was the play of Glenn Webb at the end of the season. Webb was late to blossom as a basketball player, but when he did, what a player. He was a rather small (under 6') guard in High School at Chelsea Vocational in Brooklyn and didn't play a lot. Then he hit a growth spurt. By the time Glenn stopped growing he was over 6'6" tall, yet maintained his guard skills. By the time his second season (1979-1980) came around, he was ready to help lead the Raiders (21-3) to a championship. He set a new FMCC record in the process, with 85% free throw accuracy. Webb was an outstanding player who excelled in all facets of the game. He could run and jump with the best of them (he once hit his head on the backboard blocking a shot on a fast-break); yet, he could shoot, dribble, and pass like a point guard and was a great defender.



After FMCC, Glenn transferred to Houghton College where he set school records for scoring and rebounding.

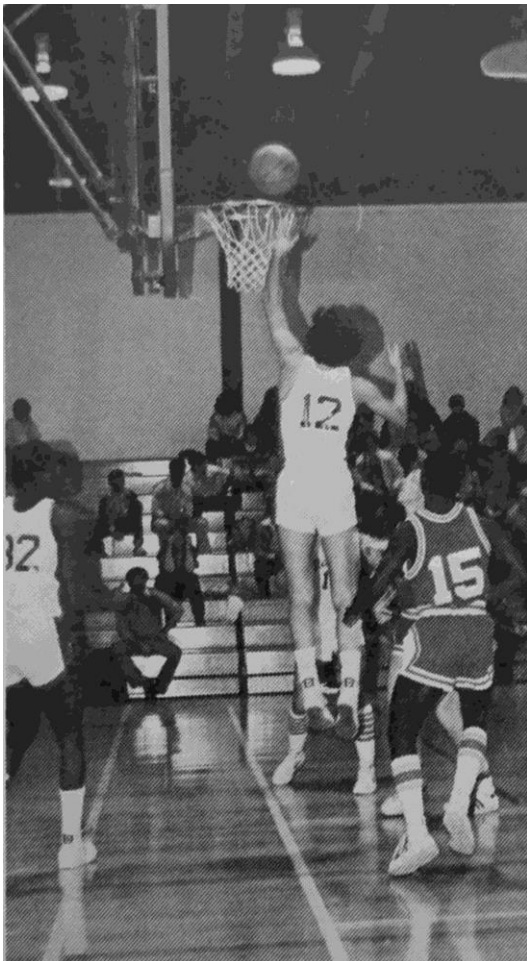
Cliff was a 6'2" forward/center from Bridgehampton, NY, where he led his school to records of 19-1, 18-2, and 17-3 and NY State Small School rankings of 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, and 4<sup>th</sup>. The local newspapers started referring to him as "Jumping Jack Cliff Wilson" early in his freshman year at FMCC, and with good reason. His jumping ability and all-around athleticism were simply awesome; words could not do him justice. You had to see to believe, and still you couldn't always believe what you saw. Cliff jumped all the way to the top of the Raiders' record book; finishing his career as the All-Time leader in Points and Rebounds. He led his team to a record of 49-10 (.831), two Mountain Valley Collegiate Conference Titles and a Region III Championship.

After graduating from FMCC, Cliff transferred to Piedmont College in Georgia, where he played two years and was one of the premier players in the nation at the NAIA level.

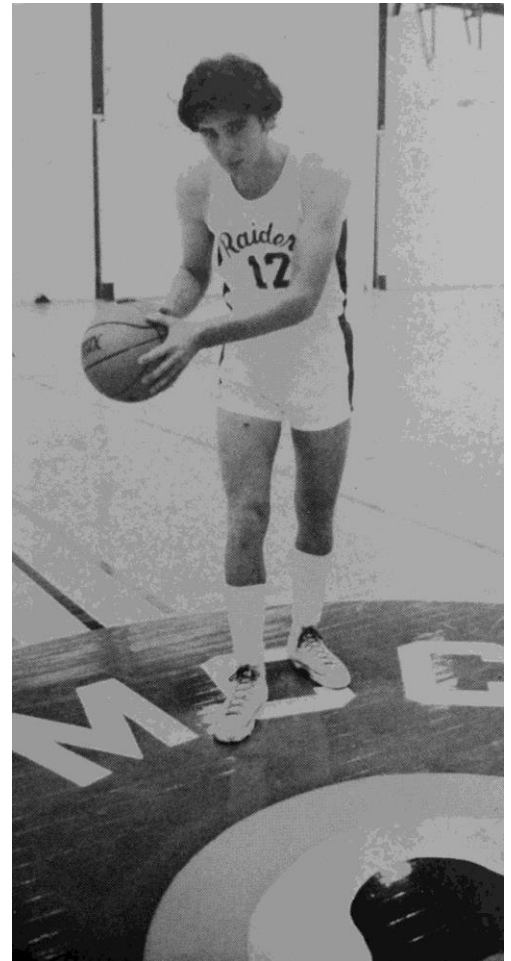


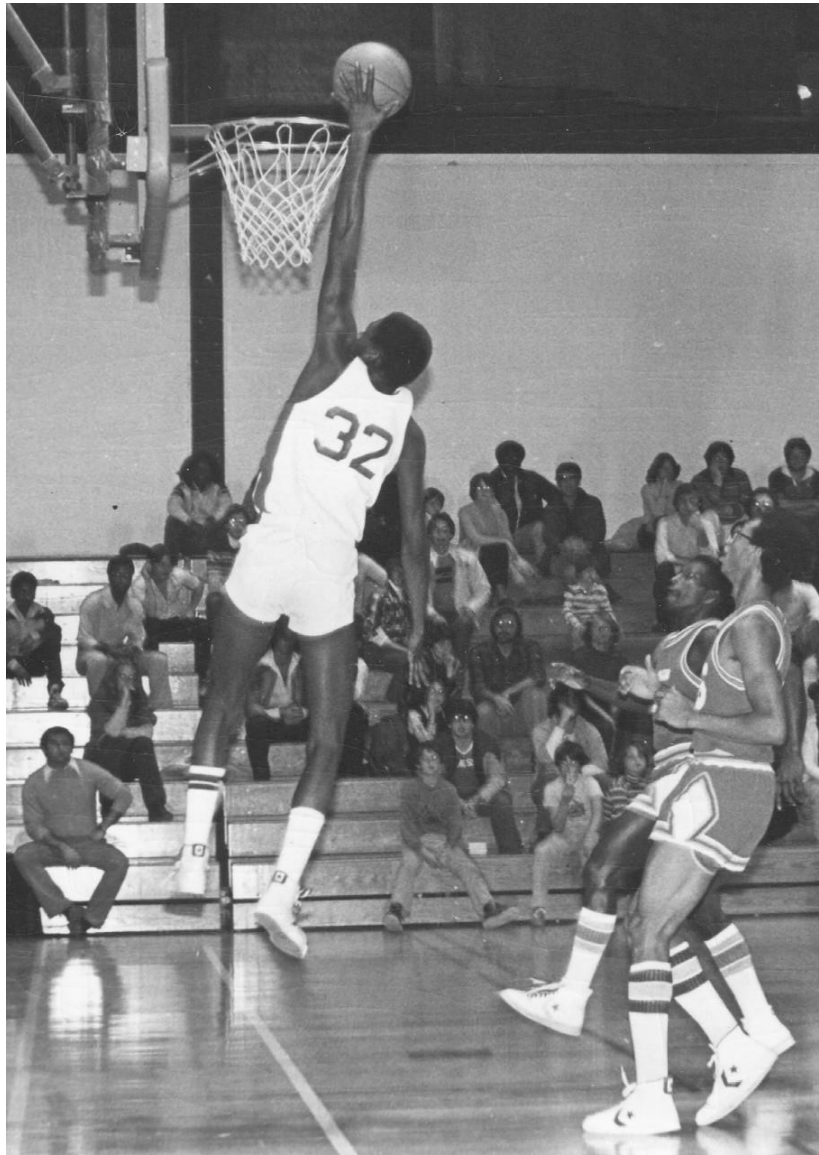

Pete averaged 10.9 Points, 3.3 Assists, and led the team with an 81.5% Free Throw Pct.

Jerome was a terrific player, from East Hampton NY, with outstanding leaping ability and strength. A 6'4" forward, he was able to score from anywhere on the floor, with an excellent jump shot, great moves around the basket and many remarkable dunks. He was a ferocious rebounder and tied the team record for rebounds in a game with 25 vs Delhi (1/25/80). He was one of the main reasons the Raiders won back-to-back conference championships, compiling a MVCC record of 19-1 in his two seasons and an over-all record of 40-8.

Before coming to FMCC, Jerome starred on the East Hampton High School basketball team that won the 1976-77 New York State Championship. After FMCC, Jerome went on to star at Division I Baltimore University, where he was also an assistant coach for a couple years after completing his basketball playing career.

**1976-1977 & 1979-1980 FMCC Raiders – Captain Lou Pondolino - MVCC All-Star (1979-80)**

Lou, like his older brother Pete, was one of the great point guards in FMCC history, and ranks high on the Raiders' career assists list. An excellent shooter, the 6'3" playmaker from Oneonta, NY was more focused on setting up his teammates and controlling the game with his ball-handling, passing, and defensive skills. His unselfish play and leadership ability helped him to establish maybe the most important record in the books, most career wins (51). In his two seasons at FMCC, the Raiders were 30-5 (1976-1977) and 21-3 (1979-1980) for an overall .864 winning percentage (also a record). His teams won two Mountain-Valley Collegiate Conference Championships (19-1) and won the Region III Championship in 1977 and finished ranked 2nd in the Region in 1980. His teams also finished ranked 18<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup>, respectively, in the national polls.

After graduating from FMCC, Lou attended Davis and Elkins College in West Virginia, where he graduated with a B.A. degree in English literary studies. After moving to Alaska, he attended the University of Alaska Anchorage, and, received his master of arts in teaching. From 1991 to 2001, he was employed as a teacher. In 2001, Lou became an assistant principal at Anchorage East High School, and three years later took the helm as principal at Robert Service High School in Anchorage where he was selected as the "Principal of the Year" for the state of Alaska in 2010.

Paul Thorne, from Brooklyn's Madison High School, was one of the truly great players in Raiders' history with unmatched consistency, scoring in double figures every game of his career. Despite standing only 6'3" tall, he routinely outplayed bigger forwards and centers with his athletic ability and basketball skills. In the above photo, Paul scores over a 6'7" defender, with his trademark turn around jump shot. He was virtually unstoppable from the post, with moves, quickness and a soft touch that resembled Bernard King in his prime.

Mike was a 6'2" guard from Canarsie High School in Brooklyn, NY. His game was similar to New York Knicks' Great Walt "Clyde" Frazier's; a consummate team-player with virtually no flaws in his game. Like Clyde, Mike was an expert at hanging in the air, drawing a foul and finishing for a three-point play (as seen in this picture). He was also, one of the best defensive players in Raiders' history.

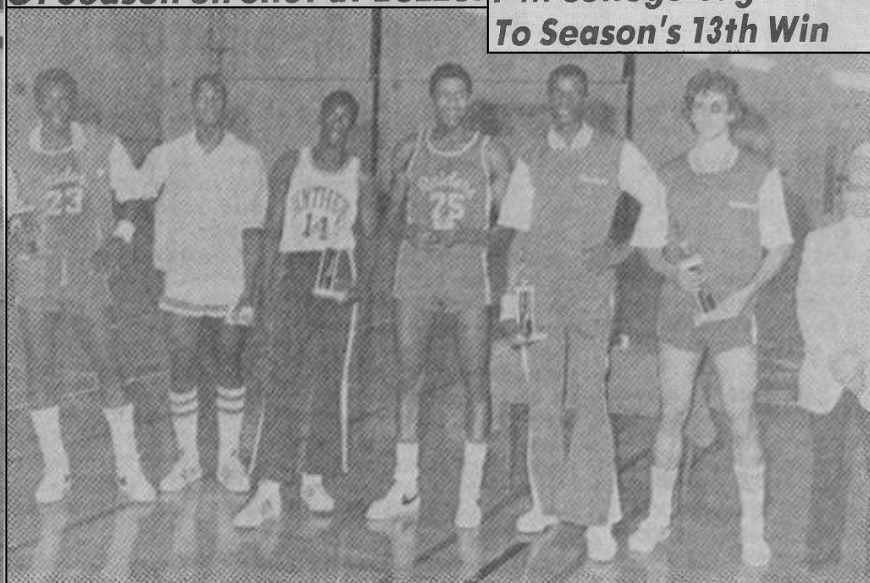

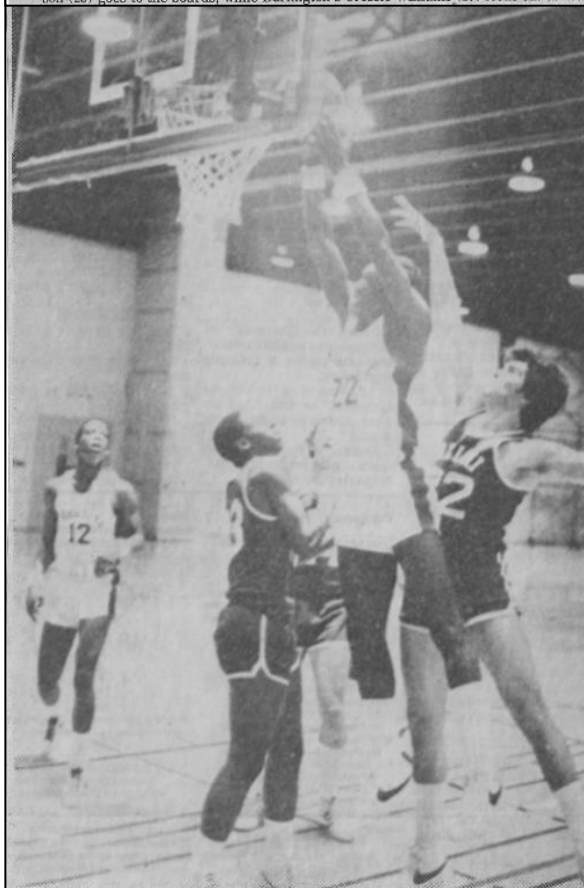

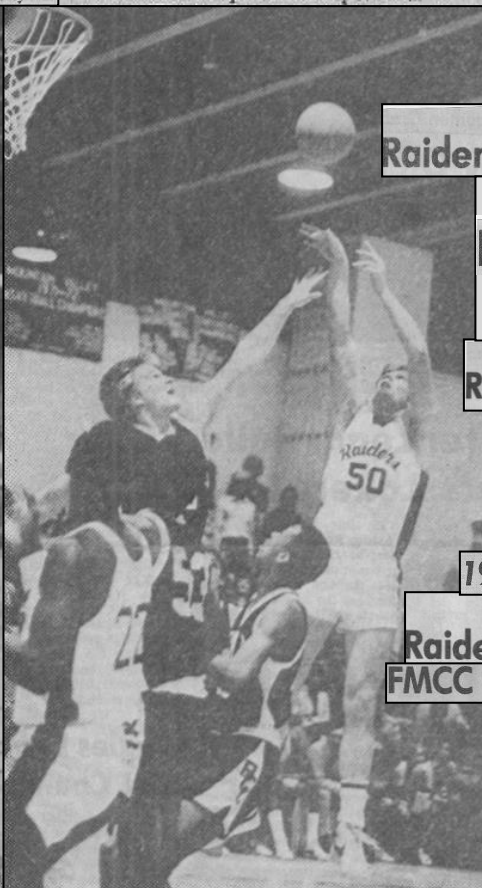

**Paul Thorne - 2 time Region III & MVCC All-Star; 1980-81 MVCC MVP  
1980-81 FMCC Athlete-of-the-Year.**

Paul was a muscular 6'3" forward from Madison High School in Brooklyn. His attributes of strength, jumping ability, quickness, speed (9.3 seconds in the 100-yard dash in high school), and a soft shooting touch, made him impossible to stop around the basket; and he was a great defender. Paul shot 58% from the field and finished his career as the Raiders' All-Time Leader in Scoring Average for a Season (23.9) and Points-per-game for his Career (20.5), despite often being several inches shorter than his opposing defender. He was, without a doubt, one of the greatest players in the history FMCC basketball.

**Stan Smalls - Region III All-Star & MVCC All-Star (1980-81)**

Stan was a 6'1" forward/guard from Alfred E Smith High School in the Bronx. As a freshman ('79-80), he excelled around the basket; his quickness and explosive jumping ability led to many dunks and finger-rolls. As a sophomore ('80-81), he was forced to evolve into a guard to better suit the needs of the team. The evolution was a success, as Stan became a complete player averaging nearly 16 points 6 rebounds and 5 assists. Stan finished his career as FMCC's All-Time Leader in Field Goal % for a season (70.1) and career (62.5).

**Jim Howley - Region III Player of the Month, November 1980.**

Jim was a 6'5" forward from Beach Channel High School in Rockaway, NY, where he was most commonly referred to by the nick-name of "Leaper" (for an obvious reason if you ever saw him play basketball). He contributed heavily off the bench as a freshman ('79-80) and was poised to be a star as a sophomore, but was lost for the season after nine excellent games (averaging 11 points & 11 rebounds).

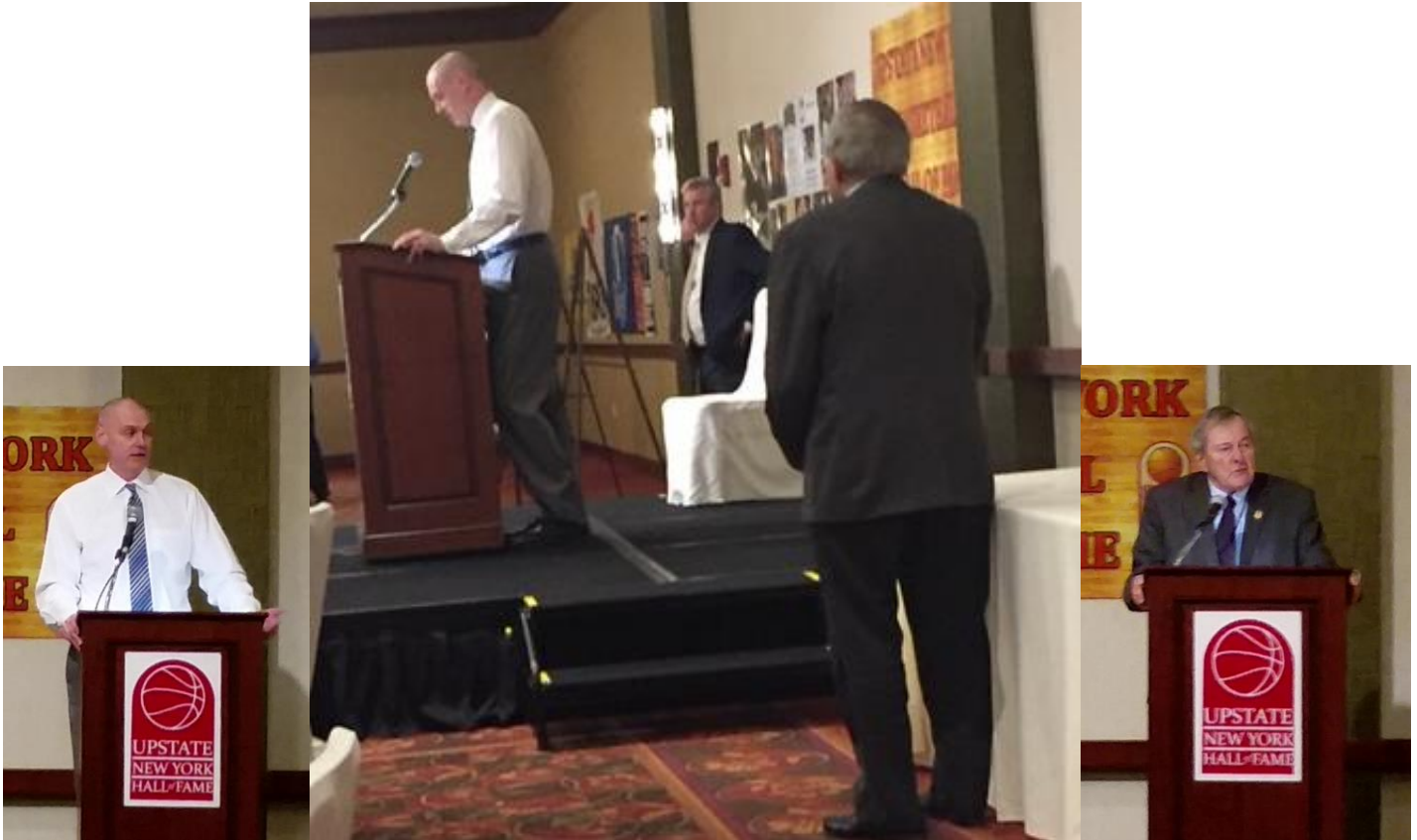
